800 Division leads the way

"STOP" UNSAFE ACTS

Safety Training Program is launched

Supervision from the 800 Division are much easier to identify these days because they are all carrying "STOP" Unsafe Acts cards in their pockets.

One side of each card is an observation check list designed to help identify unsafe acts of people before they cause injuries. The other side of the card provides space to describe unsafe acts observed and the action taken to prevent recurrence.

S-T-O-P stands for Safety Training Observation Program. It is a safety training observation course designed for supervision. Every member of management, supervision, and engineering in the 800 Division is enrolled. Their training began April 4 and is to be completed on January 4, 1978. The objective of this training system is to improve safety performance by making skilled safety observations a sustained habit by all levels of supervision. The course is administered by the IRD Training Department.

This program originated in the E. I. du Pont de Nemours & Company, Inc. and produced significant correction of unsafe acts and reduction of injuries for that company. It stimulated other efforts to eliminate injuries. It also improved safety attitudes and viewpoints.

The system consists of eight sequential units each of which

uses three different training methods:

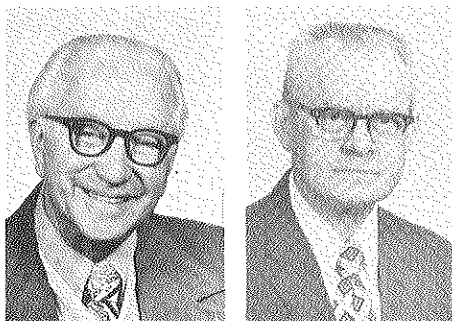
The first method is Programmed Instruction. This is a self-study method that permits each person to learn at a comfortable rate. A test is included to insure that the student understands the concepts taught.

The second method is Discussion. In the 800 Division two discussions are scheduled for each unit lesson. The first discussion occurs in a group meeting with a discussion leader. The second is held between the trainee and immediate supervision. The discussions clarify techniques and applications to the trainee's job.

The third method is On-the-Job Application with supervisory follow-up. This method allows the trainee to sharpen observation skills and gives next level supervision a way to measure safety performance.

Because of the interest of 700 Division Management, the S-T-O-P course was previously administered to that Division starting in October, 1975. General

ERDA issues final local impact statement

ERDA has issued the Final Environmental Impact Statement, which assesses the cumulative impact of operating this facility. The statement, issued on May 23, 1977, also covers the two improvement programs (CIP/CUP) due for completion in the early 1980's to increase the capacity of the present plant and offsite power plants providing electricity.

The original statement was issued on February 10, 1977. Comments received on the draft along with comments received at a public hearing on April 5, are addressed in the final statement.

Upon completion of the two improvement programs, the capacity at GAT will increase to 8.6 million separative work units (SWU) as compared to 5.2 million SWU in the unimproved capacity.

Most residents of Southern Ohio are aware of the tremendous number of bicycle riders who make the annual trek from Columbus to Portsmouth and return to Columbus early in May. One might wonder how four to five thousand riders are fed.

In Portsmouth, over 3,028 riders, ranging in age from 4 to 72, were fed at the CAY Center. Consumed was:

- 830 pounds of apple sauce
- 900 pounds of green beans
- 6,800 pieces of chicken
- 600 pounds of ham

Goodyear employees, Dave Goodman, Buck Schweinsberg, Pat Donini, Louie Donini, and Sid Secrest helped prepare the food. A total of 861 man hours were spent in preparing it.

Training's Lee Cormany, who retired in December, 1976, coordinated this presentation. According to Safety Department's Jim Spriggs, the 700 Division injury rate dropped as the training progressed.

The 800 Division's Safety Training Observation Program, coordinated by Jerry Chapman of General Training, is a major effort toward a goal that every employee endorses. Our goal is to eliminate all unsafe acts of people. DuPont's experience shows that at one point 96% of their injuries were caused by unsafe acts of people with injuries from all other causes lumped into the 4%. With General Safety and Environment, Industrial Relations, the 700 Division, and, now, the 800 Division uniting to eliminate the predominant cause of injuries, GAT employees can build a safety record second to none.
